STATEMENT OF FINANCIAL STANDING

INCOME

Public Support - \$661,470 Grants - \$542,330 Non-Cash Donations - \$146,590 <u>EXPENSES</u> Program/Projects - \$885,190 Volunteer Training - \$5,800 Administrative/Office - \$233,600 Insurance - \$51,450 As of fiscal year end, \$500,000 remained in the OCJ Kids accounts to be used for program and project expenses, as well as administrative responsibilities.

75 cents of every dollar directly impacts Arizona foster children.

OCJ Kids met Michael and Emma in early 2022. Michael came to our office to sign-up for our phone program. He recently aged out of foster care. Emma came with Michael and we met her for the first time, just weeks before their baby was due. Emma also spent time in foster care. After providing them with phones and resources for their baby, a donor family provided a car for them! Michael joined our jobs training program and they have stayed in communication with OCJ Kids. We have been blessed to bless this young family as they navigate their journey beyond foster care.

Life as a teen Mom in foster care can be a challenge. It comes with all of the new Mom challenges, trauma that led to foster care, and very little support. When OCJ Kids met this young Momma, she was learning to walk out this journey despite all of the negative things that she had faced. We provided her with handmade quilts for both Mom and baby, and clothing because these teens often come into care wearing only the clothes on their back.

As our staff became acquainted with this young Mom, we listened to her story. Her story needed to be heard and OCJ Kids made sure that the appropriate people listened. Our team has become her voice and justice is being served for this young Mom and her sweet baby girl.

The cycle stops here! The future is bright for them now.















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
