Emergency Removal Resources

In partnership with Department of Child Safety (DCS), OCJ Kids fills a gap in the underfunded system. Working with DCS, OCJ Kids provides resources to kids upon removal from their home.

Group Home Support

When a child is not reunited with family or placed in a foster home, they live in congregate care with other kids. OCJ Kids partners with 160 group homes to provide programs and support for foster kids to have opportunities like their friends.





Aged-Out and At-Risk Youth

OCJ Kids doesn't stop when a kid turns 18 years old and ages out of care.

OCJ Kids provides resources – like a transition suitcase and cellphone – and offers mentorship to help guide these young adults through life.

OCJ Kids measures impact through Points of Impact (POI), the number of times OCJ Kids connects with foster and at-risk children through resources, events, mentorship, & more! This approach ensures the creation of meaningful relationships & lifelong connections.



In partnership with doctoral students from Northern Arizona University's Occupational Therapy Department, the initiative addresses trauma-informed care for foster children and has **produced nine resource magazines**.

The Restoring Dignity Room opens!
This safe haven provides a space for young girls to learn about their bodies and be measured for bras. To date, the Restoring Dignity Room has impacted 128 foster and at-risk teen girls and youth.

At just 15, Miesha entered foster care and aged-out by 17, attending five different schools along the way.

MIESHA'S STORY

Now 20 years old, she's determined to finish her high school education while working as a caregiver.

Miesha attended OCJ Kids' Adulting Summit, a career fair designed to teach job and life skills. There, she gained insight on financial literacy for the first time.



"I didn't understand saving money. I've been living paycheckto-paycheck. The class helped me learn about budgeting, banking, and credit. Now, I'm excited to see my savings grow."



She also explored opportunities for education and career advancement.

"I reconnected with GradSolutions to restart my high school courses, and learned that I can use my caregiver qualifications to work at Honor Health. It pays better and will help me grow in my career."




















































































STATEMENT OF FINANCIAL STANDING
